Start the New Year Off With One New Al-Anon Contact!

How many times have we given a group phone list to newcomers and encouraged them to call for information or support? Maybe you are the "Newcomer Greeter" at a meeting and share your group's special information and phone list after the meeting. Or in chatting with a newcomer, you share how to access other meetings in the area or how to find log-on info for Zoom meetings. These are all ways of doing Al-Anon public outreach.

Recently I shared a group phone list with a few newcomers and encouraged them to call members on the list. I explained that the names on the list were there for a reason these were people willing to take program phone calls. My experience with the phone list has been that it's rare for a newcomer to call within 24 hours of their first meeting. They may be reluctant to reach out and make that first contact. Maybe they're embarrassed or afraid. Or feeling they are a burden to others if they call to share what's going on in their life. They may simply think they are taking too much of our time and talk themselves out of making the call. The reasons could be endless.

Imagine my surprise when I received a text later that evening from a newcomer I had given a list to. This person was looking for assistance as they were feeling anxious. I was able to offer support and suggest a reading from the book they had purchased at our meeting as well as encourage attendance at other meetings by checking out the local Al-Anon website.

It made me feel good the newcomer had the courage to text me. I'm not certain the

- Is your meeting information on the local meeting list, local and Area websites, and at the WSO up to date? Is the group's temporary electronic meeting information removed from your group record if you're back to meeting in person? Is it current, if not?
- Go to al-anon.org/temp-elc-mtg-change-form to update.
- Are signs placed in easy-to-spot places to direct people to the meeting room or specific location instructions (or, for groups meeting electronically, login and password information) included in your group record?
- Do you have a greeter to welcome anyone new to the meeting?

A welcoming checklist is also available as a free download at al-anon.org/welcomingchecklist to help you plan. Keep in mind that you can submit Al-Anon group changes at al-anon.org/update any time throughout the year.

I heard an Al-Anon delegate from the east coast on a digital meeting at the height of the pandemic say, "When I go to conference, I lead with my heart and my Higher Power." Our trusted servants know that they carry the wishes of their area/state to the conference. Once they arrive at conference, they are not only the delegate for their area, but a delegate for the whole of all Al-Anon groups. When in conference, they must follow the group conscience of the conference as a whole. Just like when groups, districts or areas have a group conscience, the body as a whole makes the decision—not just a few individuals. Once the decision is made as a group, the decision stands. At times, as individuals, we may not get our way; but we need to trust our Higher Power.

If I want something done in my everyday life, the responsibility is on me and I have to be willing to do it myself. I know I can't always rely on my dysfunctional family. They can do only what they can do. What I mean by that is I shouldn't have unrealistic expectations of them. When I want others to behave in a certain way, I am setting myself up to be disappointed. When that happens, I may find myself lashing out in anger, which only serves to make the situation worse. Bottom line? I am not working my Al-Anon program. Like at conference we think of the whole of Al-Anon. In my family, I think what is the greater good for my family? Basically, I have learned this the hard way. When I recognize these situations arising, I need to look at myself and ask:

- Have I rescued, enabled or provoked? If yes, why?
- Why am I doing the same thing over and over again and expecting a different outcome?
- Have I truly accepted these people, places and/or things?

This is one reason why meeting are so important to me. It's there I learn how to live life on life terms, which helps me with my daily interactions. For more information on Concept One see the following:

Missouri can't have an Alateen program without AMIAS (Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service). **So, I am extending an invitation to you all to consider becoming an AMIAS.** There are several ways to serve in that capacity. Group Sponsors are actively involved in helping Alateens organize and conduct meetings. An Alateen group CMA (Current Mailing Address) sends and receives correspondence for the Alateen group. AMIAS can take turns being available for Alateen meetings. Some AMIAS provide transportation to meetings and events. Some participate in Serenity Patrol so Alateens can attend Area Al-Anon and Alateen events. (As an AMIAS, you won't be a personal sponsor for an Alateen; they sponsor each other.) The pandemic brought many challenges for all of us, and our Alateen program in Missouri has had its share of them. Participation has declined in terms of numbers of teens, AMIAS and Alateen meetings. I believe these challenges can be met, and the members of Missouri Al-Anon, of which Alateen is a part, can revitalize Missouri's Alateen program.

Here is what we need to start:

- More AMIAS two AMIAS should be present for each Alateen meeting. Additionally, other AMIAS are needed to help out with each Alateen group so that service does not overwhelm anyone.
- Alateen meetings in every district, hopefully offered at the same time as Al-Anon or AA meetings.
- Alateen members a natural place to start is by reaching out to the teens you know who are affected by alcoholism. Your district may have outreach planned, so contact your DR. Of course, you can also contact Joy, our Panel 63 Public Outreach Coordinator.

Motion 6: CRITERIA AND PROCEDURES FOR ALLOWING PERMANENT ELECTRONIC GROUPS (PEGs)

Motion Passed at MO Area Assembly—November 2022

Criteria for Permanent Electric Groups (PEGs) to Join the Missouri Area:

- The PEG must be registered with the World Service Office (WSO) and share their meeting information (including time, format, group type, and platform) with the WSO. In turn, the Missouri Area Group Records Coordinator is advised by the WSO.
- If the PEG is currently in an Area other than Missouri, the PEG must have approval from the Area that it is leaving to be considered a Missouri Area PEG.



- The Group Representative (GR) for a PEG must be a GR for only that PEG.
- The GR for a PEG must be willing and able to attend District and Assembly meetings, either in person or virtually, or send an Alternate.
- The suggested duties under the "Group Service Positions" described in the current Service Manual apply to the PEG GR.
- The PEG must maintain a Current Mailing Address (CMA) for the receipt of physically mailed correspondence (i.e., Appeal Letter) from the WSO.
- The PEG may request to join a specific Missouri Area District.

Procedures for Admitting Permanent Electric Groups (PEGs) to the Missouri Area:

- The PEG must inform the Missouri Area Groups Records Coordinator of their intent to be part of the Missouri Area via email, including the reason for requesting to join the Missouri Area.
- If the PEG is leaving another Area, the Missouri Area also requires documentation that the PEG has approval to leave the former Area.

The Missouri Area Group Records Coordinator will:

- Verify the Group's record to ensure it is currently registered with the WSO.
- Contact the WSO to ensure the transfer occurs between Areas, if applicable.
- Notify the District and the Group Representatives.
- The admitted PEG will refer to the Service Manual for structure of the Al-Anon/Alateen Fellowship (Links to Service).
