STEP TWELVE

HAVING HAD A SPIRITUAL AWAKENING AS THE RESULT OF THESE STEPS, WE TRIED TO CARRY THIS MESSAGE TO OTHERS, AND TO PRACTICE THESE PRINCIPLES IN ALL OUR AFFAIRS.

"Let me remind myself that in carrying the message, what I do speaks louder than what I say. Let me not dilute the effectiveness of the help I can give by letting it take the form of giving advice. I know I will never have enough insight into another's life to tell that person what it is best to do."

One definition of a spiritual awaking is some degree of personality changes of the mind and spirit that is sufficient to promote recovery. This step causes me to pause and draw on all my previous step work. One way to have a spiritual awakening is working the steps with a sponsor. The changes in my thinking and behavior come from clearing the wreckage when I identify my character defects. By looking at the root of every issue or behavior I know what needs to be worked on or changed which makes it easier to keep the focus on me and not be controlling of others. When the psychic change happens, it is easier to work with others and carry the message. As my brother -in-law says, "people are complicated." It is a nice way to say that there are difficult people (one of which I have also been). I am powerless over people's behavior because it is what it is. When I'm healthier it is easier to practice these principles in all my affairs and carry the message as I walk into the world with a good attitude and a kind heart. I know that I cannot keep it unless I give it away. What that means to me is that I must carry the message to others. By sharing at meetings, I try to share a message of hope not a mess of myself complaining at the meeting. Service work is another way to carry the message to members of my home group about the happenings at the AIS Office, MO Districts, MO Area, and World Service. Like it says in the Al-Anon Declaration:

LET IT BEGIN WITH ME

When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, Let the hand of Al-Anon and Alateen Always be there, and Let It Begin with me.

As I reach out my hand to give help I must have something in my hand to give. This means I need to work my Al-Anon program to the best of my ability so I can "Always be there."

"They (Al-Anon Members) helped me get over my terrible loneliness by asking me to reach out to help others who were more lonely than I. I made "Twelfth Step" my middle name. I became involved in Al-Anon service work and traveled through the Area, meeting new friends, developing new interests. What a difference it made in my life."

I work very hard not to break another Al-Anon member's anonymity. I remember the saying "Who you see here, what you hear here, let it stay here." What happens at a meeting goes no further. Not gossiping is another way to keep member's anonymity. I don't tell other Al-Anon members who are at the meetings if they hadn't attended themselves. On a personal level, anonymity also can mean silence. Sometimes just being silent help keeps my EGO (Easing God Out) in check. I can keep quiet and not

be a know-it-all. I don't have to tell everybody everything I know. People have a right to their own journey. I believe that some times people need to figure things out for themselves. When Al-Anon members have their own awakening or self-realization, the lessons are learned to their heart.

There are so many things we do not have control over but we do have control over our own recovery. When we are ready to ask the questions or ask for help, we want change and the lesson is learned. That is when we become enlightened to a new way of living. Many times, for me "placing principles above personalities" means it's best to be silent.

My Spiritual foundation is happier when I mind my own business. I work very hard not to rescue, enable, and provoke people in my life (program and non-program people). I also remember my sponsor telling me once, "do you want to be happy or right?" I want to be happy so that means to me that I must pause and choose my battles with my sponsor's help.

I get the distinct impression, all the time, that through the program God is doing for us what we couldn't do for ourselves-and that no matter who we are, principles are more important than personalities."

Want To Try Public Outreach? District 2 Did It!

An Al-Anon group member wanted to bring Al-Anon and Alateen information to a nearby treatment center and IOP (Intensive Outpatient Program) in District 2. This member, Diane T., organized folders containing basic Al-Anon (photo, top right) and Alateen (photo, bottom right) information. Note: this literature is all available at our AlS office.

The folders were shared with approximately 16 case managers at the two facilities who work with recovery clients. Now these case managers will have a better understanding of alcoholism and how it affects individuals and families of the population they serve.

District 2's outreach has also increased the number of literature displays in the waiting area of one of the treatment facilities. This contact has inspired regular Al-Anon and Alateen informational meetings complementing the AA inpatient informational meetings held at the facility. In the future, District 2 plans to participate in "Lunch and Learn" gatherings for the staff by providing guest speakers.



Experienced Al-Anon members share the responsibility for conducting introductory meetings and inviting those in attendance to try regular Al-Anon/Alateen meetings. Al-Anon groups directly or through their District are encouraged to help with costs of literature and other expenses for introductory meetings. Members must comply with security requirements of the meeting location.

The meetings take place at OSF Saint Anthony's Health Center in Alton, Illinois on Thursdays from 10:00am to 11:15am. Contact Cherie or Paralea for additional information.






