Before I attended Al-Anon meetings I thought I had to do everything for my family. I thought I was being helpful, but in reality, I wanted it done my way. If I do all things then I have a chance not to get upset and then I don't have to deal with my emotions. Growing up in a dysfunctional family I was taught not to show emotions — don't think, don't feel and do not tell. We had to pre-

sent this image to the outside world. What images I do not know.

Now I think of Concept Eleven and how the World Service Office has different committees because one person or group cannot do it all. Now in my family life I can split tasks with my family members. I have been able to detach and let them do the task the way they want to do it without me interfering. In other words—stay in my own hula-a-hoop.

Concept Eleven has softened me into thinking that other people are just as capable to complete tasks in their way and open myself to others' viewpoints. Concept Eleven allows me to let other people's Higher Power take care of them. When I am open to my Higher Power's presence I can see more clearly and know that the task will get done in my Higher Power's time, not my time. This is one reason why I am so grateful for Al-Anon. It has taught me that I never have to be alone again. I can change with the help of my sponsors, the help of attending meetings and my Higher Power. 



Members must comply with security requirements of the meeting location.
