I never cease to be amazed at the talent and expertise displayed by members of the Missouri Area who give so generously of their time, talent and treasure. Well done!

NOVEMBER 2022 ASSEMBLY AGENDA

Elsewhere in this issue of the **Round Robin**, you'll find a copy of the Agenda for the November 2022 Election Assembly. It will also be posted on the Area Website at <https://www.missouri-al-anon.org> on the Calendar page, and a copy will be sent out the Missouri Area email list through the Communications Coordinator.

As I write this, the November Assembly is only about six weeks away. In addition to Electing the Officers and Coordinators who will serve the Area throughout Panel 63, the outgoing GR's will be voting on several motions that will have an effect on the Missouri Area for years – even decades – to come, including the adoption of the newly revised **Missouri Area Al-Anon/Alateen Service Digest**, and the possible restructuring of the Area Literature Depot.

It is my fervent hope that the Groups and the Districts will elect their new Representatives within the next few weeks, so that our incoming trusted servants will have an opportunity to attend the November Assembly either in-person or via Zoom so they can get up-to-speed before their terms formally begin in January. It seems inevitable that the Group Representatives serving in Panel 63 will be the body that actually votes on the Alateen Safety and Behavioral Guidelines that we previewed at the recent AWSC Meeting. We will discuss that document in detail in November. Rather than restart the conversation from scratch at the March 2023 AWSC Meeting, it would be of great benefit to the Area if the new Panel 63 GRs and DRs could be part of the discussion from the very beginning, at the November 2022 Election Assembly.

Ask It Basket Questions and Answers

August 2022 AWSC Meeting

1. For Convention, if any Convention committee member is asked to attend convention because of their job duties that are required in person at the convention, does the Missouri Area pay their convention registration?

Answer: For a convention committee member to have any expenses reimbursed for convention, the convention coordinator must notify the Area Treasurer prior to the convention if the committee member needs to be present for convention because of their job duties. The expenses paid by the Area are hotel and mileage to the convention and back home from the convention. The registration fee(s) for the convention are not reimbursed by the Missouri Area.

2. The groups that are not meeting due to the pandemic, will they need to decide whether they need to disband or resume meeting face to face after the November assembly if the Missouri Area GRs vote yes on the procedures that will be presented by the Electronic Group Task Force?

Answer: There currently is not a deadline for a group to decide to go back to meeting face to face. If the facility where the group was meeting face to face is still closed, then the group can remain electronic. The procedure that will be proposed to the Missouri Area GRs will address several scenarios and this situation is one of the scenarios.

The only issue at this point is if the AIS office or the Missouri Area Group Records Chairperson is not notified of how the group is currently meeting (on line), then there is a chance that the group could be reported for "not meeting" if a newcomer or member shows up and no one is at the face to face meeting location. The very least the group should do is give the AIS office and the Missouri Area Group Records coordinator the contact information or provide an individual that a person wanting to attend to call for group contact/meeting information.

3. What does AWSC Stand for?

Answer: AWSC stands for Area World Service Committee. The Missouri Area has this meeting in March and August and the main purpose and intent is to plan the upcoming assemblies held in May and November every year. The purpose of the meeting is further described in the Missouri Area Procedures document that can be found on the Missouri Area website: www.missouri-al-anon.org, behind the For Members section.



Forum Literature Corner

Although Conference Approved Literature prices increased starting August 1, please continue to support WSO by purchasing and using a variety of literature in meetings. Check the current Forum issue to see what CAL is being requested to be shared about.

The printed form of the 2022-2025 Service Manual will not likely be available for purchase until the end of 2022. According to the new price list, it will cost \$11. That will give members a chance to save for this price increase.

The Magazine editor, Carol Cowan, provided the information about the Forum. Were you aware that the Forum is printed in French and Spanish? There are six issues per year. "For the past year or so, a team at the WSO has been working on making our Writing Guidelines and online submission processes more inclusive of our Spanish- and French-speaking members.

While the WSO has always accepted submissions in Spanish and French, provided they are accompanied by an English translation (see "Writing Meetings," pages 42–43 in the [2022–2025 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual](#)), the Writing Guidelines and online submission information and forms will soon also be available in Spanish and French, making the process itself more accessible and inclusive. We plan to launch the translated web pages, Writing Guidelines, and online forms for magazine submissions by October or November of this year.

Please note that sharings in Spanish and French must still be accompanied by an English translation as the WSO does not currently have the resources to translate member submissions. Areas and Districts with bilingual members are invited to consider offering help with translation."

There cannot be a Forum without sharings from members so as individuals, please consider submitting writings to the Forum by email or regular mail. You may go to the website (www.al-anon.org) to review the guideline F-1 and submit it directly. Or your group or district could ask the Forum/Literature to have a writing workshop via Zoom or in person. District 14 asked us to do one recently. Contact us for more information.

Al-Anon/Alateen Family Groups

As the Missouri Area comes to the end of Panel 60 all the major service responsibilities of my position as Alternate Delegate have come to an end as well. Here is a recap of Panel 60 from the perspective of the Alternate Delegate.

This was a unique panel for the Missouri Area with the onset of the Pandemic. Luckily with a group of forward-thinking Officers the Missouri Area was able to have all its Area Business meetings. It was definitely a group effort.

One of the challenges of the Panel was doing “training sessions” for Area Trusted Servants. Part of the Alternate Delegates service responsibilities is to conduct these sessions, for District Representatives and Group Representatives as well as Orientation before each Assembly for first time attendees. With the transition to Hybrid AWSC meetings and Area Assemblies and the equipment and set up available these have dwindled towards the end of the Panel. Next Panel’s Alternate Delegate will have to meet this continuing challenge with innovation and imagination.

Despite the Pandemic three successful Area Day in Services were held.

- The 2020 Day in Service, Dreaming Big with 20/20 Vision was hosted by District 25 and was held virtually with eighty-nine folks registered.
- In 2021 we saw a return to In Person attendance with an opportunity for virtual attendance as well. The Day in Service was hosted by the KC AIS which encompasses, Districts 1, 19, 20 & 21. The theme was Gratitude: A Springboard to Action. Forty-three Missouri Area members attended In Person and twenty-eight attended virtually.
- 2022 The theme was Mining for Hidden Treasure: Discovering the Gifts Within Us, hosted by District 14. It was held In Person and virtually. Forty-one attended In Person and 21 attended virtually.

As the Al-Anon Liaison to the Missouri State AA Convention (MOSC) with Al-Anon participation, I served on the AA Convention Committee. MOSC was held virtually in 2020

and In Person in 2021 & 2022. The AA convention committee voted to have 2 Al-Anon Speakers each year. Attendance at the Virtual Convention held on line had 438 registered, 2021 had 345 registered and the 2022 Convention which just ended had 488 registered. Al-Anon was well represented each year and we were able to bring literature this year and sold over \$1,000.00 in books and pamphlets. The MOSC Working Committee began meeting virtually via Zoom and holding monthly meetings. This practice will continue in the coming years and proved to be instrumental in holding a successful convention.

In the last year of the Panel a “job fair” as recommended in our Leadership Support Procedures was held. Although not stated in the Procedures historically this has been organized by the Alternate Delegate. This year, the “job fair” was entitled the Service Position Expo. It is hoped that it provided information and inspiration to facilitate area members who are eligible to consider standing for Area Service Positions.

The opportunity to serve as Interim Chair arose again as our Panel 60 Chair, Sarah S. stepped down to become the Director of Programs at the World Service Office. Having served as Chair for 2 years in Panel 57 made this responsibility less daunting this time around. As always, the “we” of the program was experienced as the panel of officers and the newly formed Tech Team stepped up to support me. Together we got through the November 2021 Assembly where a new Chair, Michael C, was elected.

There have been opportunities this Panel for me to take on tasks outside my official responsibilities. I had the opportunity to serve as an unofficial member of the Tech Team; to figure out how to manage our Zoom account; how to do email blasts and more. Now a formal Tech Team has been established, the registration process has been refined and the Communications Coordinator has learned the email blast system. The challenge for me is to step aside. I’ve had many opportunities to practice the Traditions and Concepts. I learned about “double headed management” and “the right of decision.” The slogans “let go and Let God” and the unofficial slogan “MYOB” are tools I have used amply.

The best lessons in the Traditions and Concepts come in active service. Serving as a member of the Procedures task force and now the Procedures Committee has provided those lessons in new and interesting ways. The reorganized Service Digest is an example of the “we” of our program.

Thank you for allowing me to serve the Missouri Area as the Alternate Delegate. I couldn’t have done it without you!

Group Records

Hello all-

As of August 13, 2022, the Missouri Area has registered 265 Al-Anon groups and 15 Alateen groups. With some of these Al-Anon and Alateen groups meeting more than one day a week, the Area has 199 Active Al-Anon meetings and 8 Active Alateen meetings per month. The Area has 59 inactive groups currently as well as three (3) groups in "No Mail" status and seven (7) group are listed as "Not Reported Meeting".

Of our 26 districts, 17 districts have DR's. The Area needs DR's in the following districts:

01, 03, 07, 11, 20,21,22,24, 26, and 27.

The most recent changes regarding group records with WSO (World Service Organization) have been trying to assist groups with electronic meeting vs. typical group meetings. Some are meeting electronically only but haven't shared this new information with anyone. If this information is needing to be changed for your group(s), please reach out using the following form through WSO to update about the changes. District reps can also help keep the data current by checking in with your individual groups to make sure that CMA (current mailing address) as well as contact information is being kept up-to-date. Remember that individuals and their addresses, phone numbers, and email addresses change especially group representatives.

Giving back has provided me with an enormous amount of growth and helped me realize I have areas of my life to continue to improve! ...Progress not perfection, right?! Thank you so much for the honor to be providing service in this position!

What is a group business meeting? What is a group conscience?

A group business meeting may be regularly scheduled or called when needed.

The 2022 -2025 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual describes those meetings on page 46 and suggested helps for holding them continue on pages 47-49. "Decisions a group makes are determined by an informed group conscience." Page 48 describes the group conscience as "the result of the group's business meetings. The group conscience is the will of the group."

So we hold business meetings to discuss group topics such as changing time or location, getting a new Current Mailing Address(CMA), planning projects or events, and other such business. If a decision has special weight or involves members' concerns and opinions, it becomes a group conscience discussion and may result in a group conscience decision.

The Service Manual suggests elements of both including making sure all members are heard and that a Higher Power is included. The group may decide how group conscience decisions are recorded (so we remember and don't needlessly go over the same topics). We can always say, "This is what we decided; do we want to revisit that topic?"

The Manual describes a group conscience meeting as one where everyone has access to all of the information, shares information as equals, and places principles above personalities.

The whole process relies on the Twelve Traditions and the Twelve Concepts of Service.

My home group reads the Three Obstacles to Success on pages 20 and 21 of the new Service Manual at meetings. We have found that we don't spend time on group problems because reading the Three Obstacles seems to keep most problems from

occurring.

So Al-Anon's unique way of dealing with questions and issues gives us a firm pattern and workable method that keeps us on an even keel and includes all the members.

Can newcomers find your meeting?

Overview of Position:

This committee is a just one part of the Missouri Area’s commitment to the ongoing support of our trusted servants, which includes encouragement, mentoring, clear expectations, and training. The Leadership Support Committee is appointed to address concerns of members when a trusted servant is struggling to perform their responsibilities. The Committee meets to discuss, research, clarify, and then make recommendations to the Area Chair. As a Committee Member you will be available for such meetings and must hold all information in the strictest confidence. The Leadership Support Committee Chair will attend all Area Business meetings and give reports to increase awareness of the Leadership Committee. They may attend In Person or virtually.

Chief Responsibilities:

- Meet as a committee to study the Area procedures regarding Leadership Support.
- The Leadership Support Committee Chair will attend Area Business meetings to raise awareness of Committee.
- Chair also ensures that names and contact of members of committee is accessible.
- Meet, by phone, email, or otherwise, soon after a concern is brought to one of the committee members, keeping the anonymity of the person who expressed the concern.
- Meeting with the person about whom the concern was made to gather more information.
- Reviewing, discussing, researching, and discerning an appropriate recommendation for the Area Chair.
- The Chair will then communicate Committee’s recommendation to the Area Chair

Skills suggested (or willingness to learn)

- The ability to keep total anonymity surrounding the workings of the committee and the people involved.
- Compassion for the individuals involved as well as the ability to keep the principles of our program and the best interest of the Area in mind.
- The ability to presume good will.
- Good communication skills, verbal and written.
- Use of email and conference calling is helpful.
- A careful study and knowledge of the Area Procedures for Leadership Support.
- Experience as a District Representative, Officer, and/or Coordinator are required qualifications.

Treasurer’s Report:

We are back from the AWSC meeting and still a bit tired, but happy that we had the chance to get together to discuss upcoming changes for the Area. I was impressed with the amount of work every one of the task forces put into their projects! Once again, I am reminded of the saying, “Every cloud has a silver lining.” The COVID pandemic is not something I would have chosen to go through, but because of it we are using Zoom for these meetings. That has not only saved the Area all the mileage expense that would have been needed in the past, but saved those members travel time that they could then devote to the project itself. I think those of us attending AWSC could see the benefits of that simple (?) change.

I was busy writing quite a few checks as you can probably tell by looking at the “expense” line in the checking account report. Our income line has been increased by the Convention registration and meal reservations that have come in so far this month. I’m looking forward to the Convention and seeing all these folks who have registered to come!

I am scheduled to meet with the Finance Committee on September 7. We will be discussing whether or not to bring any motions to the November Assembly regarding Area finances. Tony and Ellen are working on the Budget for 2023. I have been impressed with how well we have done in being in line with the 2022 budget that was largely (99.44%) Tony’s work last year. The Area and I are really blessed by the Finance Committee’s work!

As I reported at AWSC, I moved \$3,000.00 out of the savings account into CD “B” when it matured in August. I plan to move an additional \$3,000.00 out of savings and add it to CD “C” when it matures later this month. The savings account will be maintained mostly to have a place to hold money’s until it is time to move it into one CD or another. While the savings account does not earn much interest, the checking account earns none. As long as we keep some money in the savings account, we are not charged any fees that would negate the benefit.

September is the third month of the third quarter. This year is winding down and we are approaching the end of the panel. I really will be glad to hand this position over to the next person, but I also want to say I appreciate the opportunity that you have given me to learn new things. I also want to thank you for your encouragement as I learned them! I really do love the people of the Missouri Area!
